OFFICIAL DIVISIONS (INCORPORATING COMPOSITE-SCHOOL CREWS)
(THIS EVENT IS NOT INTENDED FOR PRIMARY/JUNIOR SCHOOL PUPILS.)

COXED FOURS

DIVISION A Open to all schoolboys.

DIVISION B Open to schoolboys who had not attained the age of 16 years before 1st September, 2006.

DIVISION C Open to schoolboys who had not attained the age of 15 years before 1st September, 2006.

DIVISION D Open to all schoolgirls.

DIVISION E Open to schoolgirls who had not attained the age of 16 years before 1st September, 2006.

DIVISION F Open to schoolgirls who had not attained the age of 15 years before 1st September, 2006.

COXED QUADRUPLE SCULLS

DIVISION G Open to schoolboys who had not attained the age of 14 years before 1st September, 2006.

DIVISION H Open to schoolgirls who had not attained the age of 14 years before 1st September, 2006.

COXES A schoolboy or schoolgirl of any age may be used as a cox in any of the Divisions listed above.

LIFEJACKETS/BUOYANCY AIDS

In accordance with S.A.R.A. Rules, coxes must wear suitable lifejackets or buoyancy aids and all boats used must comply with the recently-amended SARA Water Safety Code as regards buoyancy, heel restraints, bowballs, etc.

THE PETER GRIEVE MEMORIAL SCHOOL TEAM TROPHY

In memory of the late Peter Grieve, who did so much for Scottish Schools' Rowing, a team trophy is contested annually. **Every Division** (A to H) will count equally towards this Trophy, according to the following scheme :-

(a) In each division, 15 points will be awarded to the first crew, 10 points to the second crew and 5 points to the third crew. To obtain points, however, a crew must have beaten at least one crew in their division. In the case of Composite-School crews, points will be awarded on a directly proportional basis.

(b) The totals awarded to a School will be based on the **THREE HIGHEST SCORES WHICH THE SCHOOL OBTAINS**, so it is important to enter at least three crews, although the Trophy could be won with fewer.

(c) In the case of a tie for the Trophy, the competition will be decided by the **FOUR HIGHEST SCORES** obtained by the Schools in question, and then, if necessary, by the **FIVE HIGHEST SCORES**, etc .
